To sign up please:

- ◆ *Complete and sign the enrollment form on the reverse*
- ◆ *Attach your personal blank cheque marked "void"*
- ◆ *Return to the church office on Sunday, or by mail*

Please be assured that all information will be held in strict confidence by our finance personnel. Your annual income tax receipt will be issued as usual. Any changes to the withdrawal amount or bank account information will be required in writing with your signature and will require one month's notice.

Here's how this Pre-Authorized Giving works

It's a modern, easy method to make those recurring payments such as your regular church tithe/offering without the inconvenience of cheque writing or rushing to the bank or ABM for the cash. With your permission, your tithe/offering can be made automatically through your bank or financial institutional account.

It's convenient

The Pre-Authorized giving method eliminates the need for you to write cheques or use cash for your church tithe/offering. With our flexible dates of the 1st and 16th of each month you can choose the one (or both) that best fits your budget or payday cycle.

It's economical

One authorization is all that is required for your tithe/offering to be made automatically through your bank or financial institution chequing account.

It's secure

With Pre-Authorized Giving there are no cheques to be lost or worry because you couldn't get to church with your tithe/offering. You may stop payment at any time if you feel it is necessary to do so.

It's assured

If you are away on vacation, out of town on business or sick, your tithe/offering will be given on time.

What are your rights and responsibilities?

1. Should an incorrect amount be processed against your account, it will be corrected when you advise The Salvation Army Mississauga Temple Community Church.
2. We will provide you with written notice of the date and amount of your Pre-Authorized tithe/offering amount. This will be done before your first payment and subsequently if you make a change in your amount or payment date.
3. If a payment processed against your account is not in accordance with your authorization, because you cancelled your authorization in writing to The Salvation Army Mississauga Temple, then you can ask your bank (by completing a "Declaration Form" at the branch where your account was debited, any time up to ninety (90) calendar days after your account is debited for the payment, to return the payment to you. After this time period the Bank is not responsible to return the payment, and you must deal directly with The Salvation Army Mississauga Temple for reimbursement.
4. Should you move your account from one bank or branch to another, you **MUST** advise The Salvation Army Mississauga Temple of the change and they will arrange a new agreement with you so your payments can continue uninterrupted.

You continue to have control just as with cheques you have written. You can instruct the branch to stop a payment before it goes through your account and you can discontinue payments altogether, if desired, by advising The Salvation Army Mississauga Temple in writing.
